- Complete short-term assignments for the growth of District Environmental Education Programs.
- Select, develop and complete a fellowship term project.
- Work with Forest Preserve District staff to plan special events.
- Complete assignments and readings related to interpretive skill development.
- Provide on-site security measures as needed.

- Commit to reside in Fellow Housing in a potentially co-ed living environment with other Naturalist Teaching Fellows.
- Have experience working with children in a teaching capacity.
- Maintain a high level of self-motivation and enthusiasm, and have an eagerness to learn.
- Possess basic computer skills with software such as Microsoft Outlook, Excel and Word.
- Certified in CPR and Standard First Aid. The District will provide training if the applicant does not have current certification.
- Comfortable in non-motorized watercrafts and have a capability to enter, maneuver and exit canoes and kayaks.
