Graduate Assistantship in Recreation, Sport and Tourism

The Department of Recreation, Sport and Tourism at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign invites applications for a doctoral research assistantship beginning in Fall 2020. The successful candidate will work closely with Dr. Jules Woolf and is expected to conduct high-quality research in the area of sport management.

Students from any social science discipline interested in sport management are encouraged to apply. Preference will be given to applicants with research interests that align with Dr. Woolf's research agenda (https://ahs.illinois.edu/woolf). This involves exploring the nexus between sport and health, with specific emphasis placed on doping in sport and sport development.

The qualified candidate will be offered a nine-month 50%-time (i.e., 20 hours per week) research assistantship for the first two years of study, which includes a competitive monthly stipend, a tuition waiver, and health insurance benefits. Opportunity to renew the assistantship is available, contingent on the student's satisfactory performance and availability of funding.

- Assist with the development and coordination of research projects.
- Conduct literature reviews.
- Participate in data collection.
- Analyze quantitative and qualitative data.
- Contribute to conference presentations, manuscript preparation and other research outputs.

Qualifications:

- Hold or currently completing a master's degree.
- Previous experience in quantitative, qualitative, or mixed-methods research.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills.
- Ability to collaborate with others.
