POSITION: Teaching, Fieldwork and Lab Assistant II

QUALIFICATIONS:

REQUIRED:

- Acceptance into SUNY Cortland Recreation, Parks and Leisure Studies graduate program
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
- Record keeping and other organizational skills
- Database development and maintenance computer skills
- Clean driving record/eligible for campus approval as van driver

DESIRED:

Experience working with college students in a supervisory role

RELATION TO EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM: This assistantship provides opportunities to gain valuable experience in facilitating the field-based learning experiences of recreation undergraduate students. It also provides opportunities to utilize computer database design and management skills for a recreationbased program.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- o Facilitate the service learning (fieldwork hours) for REC 293: Diversity & Inclusive Recreation Services (fall/spring) (usually around 50 students total, each doing 25 hours). Assist with the facilitation of service learning (lab and fieldwork hours) in two courses per semester: REC 280/380: Programming and Leadership in Recreation, Parks and Leisure Services (fall/spring) (usually around 50 students total, each doing 30 hours). Maintain internship database for REC 470: Senior Seminar. This entails the following:
 - Extensive collaboration and communication with community recreation and human service agencies in the Cortland/Ithaca/Syracuse area.
 - Planning responsibilities, including record keeping.
 - Transporting students to service learning sites in the Cortland/Ithaca/Syracuse area.
 - Weekly grading of fieldwork reports from students and monitoring of hours.
 - Adding, updating, and maintaining records in internship computer database.
- Other duties as assigned.

SALARY: 3-credit resident tuition waiver per semester plus \$7,333 stipend for the year
