When does camp start and end? Will I get time off?

Sleep-away camps run Sunday afternoon to Friday afternoon, with campers staying overnight. Day camps run Monday morning through Friday late afternoon. Staff will have time off between camp sessions.

What's nearby to do during time off?

Camp High Hopes is about a ten minute drive from downtown Sioux City, which has numerous restaurants, movie theatres, and shops. Sioux City is also home to a variety of summer activities, such as outdoor concerts, farmer's markets, and festivals.

POSITION	DESCRIPTION
SLEEPAWAY COUNSELOR	Primary caregiver for campers with disabilities in the sleep-away program. Includes personal care assistance, activity adaptation, and behavior management. Reside in cabin with assigned campers and a co-counselors.
ARCHERY	Leads archery activities, helping campers to adapt to their needs and achieve their target goals. Prior archery experience beneficial
ARTS & CRAFTS	Plans and leads arts & crafts activities, infusion personal creative into fun and engaging activities.
NATURE EDUCATION	Guide campers in learning about the outdoors and all its wonders. Plans and leads all associated activities.
REC & GAMES	Design and engage campers in creative, adaptive games and sports related activities that encourage participation, not competition.
MONKEY TREE	Lead adaptive climbing and ropes course related activities. Prior climbing experience beneficial.
WATERFRONT LIFEGUARD	Responsible for leading waterfront area, adapting activities, and providing lifeguard supervision during fishing, canoeing, and paddle boating.
DAY CAMP COUNSELOR	Primary caregiver for campers with disabilities in the day care program. Includes personal care assistance, activity adaptation, and behavior management. Does not reside on camp property.
SUMMER CAMP NURSE	Assist Health Care Director with management of camp health center, camper medical treatments, and camper medications. Resides on site and manages on-call duties overnight. Must be RN or LPN.
